




When I was transported from the ghetto by the Nazis, I was separated from my brother and mother and sent into a slave labor camp in Poland. I just wanted to stay alive so that I could be reunited with my family. That's what kept me going during that time.

I was in several different concentration camps for a total of four years—Poznan, Auschwitz, Gross-Rosen, Regensburg. We were forced to do brutally hard physical labor for twelve hours a day, sometimes more, with almost nothing to eat.

My wish to live and to be with my family kept me going to a certain extent, but then later on, after a while, I just automatically kept on going from day to day. Just surviving and trying to stay alive.


